Spend the day viewing all the Bellagio has to offer.

To begin your tour, walk to the Monte Carlo and take the tram to the Bellagio.

The Bellagio is home to several original works by Dale Chihuly, including the *Fiori Di Como*, which is prominently displayed in the lobby.

Adjacent to the lobby is the Conservatory & Botanical Gardens. This exhibit changes every season, bringing new plants and arrangements to enjoy. *Autumn Harvest* will be the exhibit in October.

The Bellagio Gallery of Fine Art exhibits some of the finest known artworks. The exhibit on display through October 26<sup>th</sup> is *Painting Women: Works from the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston.* General Admission is \$16.

After 3:00 pm, visit the Bellagio Fountain in front of the hotel where you will see the fountains dance to music. Performances are every half-hour from 3-7 pm and every fifteen minutes from 7:00 to midnight.

When you leave the fountain, walk south to The Cosmopolitan (between the Bellagio and the Aria, in front of the Vdara). Take an escalator to the 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> floor and look for one of six Art-o-mats, refurbished cigarette machines that sell small works of art. You can take home some art for \$5.

From The Cosmopolitan, you can head north to the Bellagio, east to the Vdara, or south to the Aria where you can catch the tram back to the Monte Carlo.
